**Utility Bill Payment Options** We now have several new options for paying your monthly utility bill. **Online**: You can pay your bill using your credit card through our new payment portal. (https://www.municipalonlinepayments.com/socialcirclega/) If you create an account, you can view your utility history, save the credit card information to be used with future payments, set up auto pay, sign up to have your bill emailed to you, and submit service requests. Creating an account is not necessary to pay your bill. **By telephone**: Call 877-840-5562 24-hours a day to access the interactive payment portal. Be sure to have your account number and street address handy in order to complete the payment process. **At City Hall**: You can still come into or call City Hall, drop your payment in the night box, mail your payment or use bill pay through your bank. To ensure your payments are credited the same day, please make your payments at City Hall by coming in or calling.

If you use bill pay through your bank to pay your City utility bill, please update your account number to ensure your payment gets properly credited to your account. **Upcoming Construction Projects** & N Cherokee Sidewalk: The long awaited sidewalk replacement project on N Cherokee Rd from E Hightower Trail to the Blue Willow Inn will begin construction this month. The project is anticipated to be completed within four months. This construction is funded with a Federal Transportation Enhancement Grant that was awarded to the City several years ago. N Cherokee Water Mains: New water mains are being installed downtown to improve water pressures and fire flows. In addition, the higher volume of water will enable better circulation of water within the water system. The locations of work are W Hightower from Clark St to N Cherokee, Clark St, Juniper St, and Heritage Park and N Cherokee from W Hightower to Heritage Park. The project will begin in August and is anticipated to last about three months, barring any weather or work stoppages.
