Water Quality Report

Exchange Zone Established

As a result of recent events , the Social Circle Police Department has created a safe exchange zone in front of the Social Circle Police Department. The exchange zone, which is covered by 24-hour surveillance video, can be used for child custody, private property and e-commerce transactions.

Alcova Roundabout

ATT has been working to relocate their facilities from the pole that is in conflict with the roundabout. As of June 13, the last copper splice was completed and removed. The ATT fiber relocation is in progress and is scheduled to be cut over to the new poles on July 14. The remaining cables will be removed and cleared the following week, enabling the pole to be removed by Georgia Power. There are approximately three weeks of roadway and sidewalk construction work remaining to complete the roundabout project once the pole is removed. We appreciate the patience of the community during this construction project, and look forward to the improved traffic patterns and pedestrian safety that will result. To suggest a news topic, an update topic or to submit news items of community interest, please email aroundthewell@socialcirclega.com **Underground Gas Pipe Maintenance** As your natural gas distributor, the City of Social Circle is required, in accordance with federal regulations, to make you aware of certain safety recommendations regarding your underground natural gas piping. The City of Social Circle operates our gas system with an emphasis on safety. We are required to design, operate, and maintain our underground natural gas pipeline system in accordance with prescribed federal safety standards.

The gas department **does not** maintain the gas piping downstream of the gas meter. This is the responsibility of the customer who owns that piping. If the buried pipe is not properly maintained, it may be subject to **corrosion** (if the piping is metallic) and/or **leakage**. To ensure the continued safe and reliable operation of these lines, the buried piping should be checked periodically. You (or the building owner) are advised to contact a licensed plumber or heating contractor to assist you in locating and inspecting your buried gas piping. If any unsafe condition is found, repairs must be made ASAP. The Yellow Pages are an excellent source for listings of licensed plumbers and heating contractors. If we can answer any questions regarding this notice, please call Social Circle City Hall at 770-464-2380. You may disregard this notice if you do not have buried piping beyond the gas meter.

Call 811 Before You Dig Should you plan to dig around buried piping, especially buried gas piping, the piping should be located in advance and all digging should be carefully done by hand in the vicinity of the pipe. You must contact the Georgia One Call Center at 800-282-7411 (or 811) three days before any digging by you or your contractor so that all buried cable may be located. This is a free service. Flag colors and what they represent: red: electric power lines, cable, conduit and lighting cables; orange: telecommunication, alarm, or signal lines, cable or conduit; yellow: natural gas, oil, steam, petroleum or other gaseous or flammable materials; green: sewers and drain lines; blue: drinking water; purple: reclaimed water, irrigation, and slurry lines; pink: temporary survey markings, unknown/unidentified facilities; white: proposed excavation limits or route.

Leaf and Brush Collection Collection Collection Collection of leaves and brush is now weekly again in all areas of Town on your scheduled pickup day. We want to thank you for being patient while we got all the equipment ready to better serve you. City crews have been working very hard to get back on schedule and provide you the best service possible for leaf, grass clippings, and brush removal. To keep things running smoothly, we want to work as a team to ensure services are provided in a timely manner and equipment is in top working order. The following are some tips for ensuring our crews provide the best service possible:

1. Do not put trash, rocks, metal, dirt, and items that may damage the blades on the leaf and brush machine. These items can cause equipment failure and costly repairs preventing the crews from providing service to you.

2. Separate leaf piles from brush piles and keep limbs to approximately 4 inches or less in diameter.

3. Crews will normally spend 15 minutes on a leaf or brush pile. If they spend longer than that then the piles are too big causing the crews to get behind delaying service to other citizens. However, they can spend 15 minutes each week on a large pile until it is gone.

4. If you see our trucks pass your leaves and brush without picking it up, the trucks are full and need to be emptied. They will return to finish your piles. If they miss your pile by mistake, call City Hall to request a pick up.

5. If you forget to put your pile of leaves and brush next to the road on your scheduled pickup day crews will pick it up the following week on your scheduled day of pickup.

6. If crews find an issue with your pile of leaves or brush, they will leave a hang tag. Please read the tag and take the appropriate actions. Once you have, call City Hall for pickup or wait until your next scheduled pickup day.

7. There will be times when your leaf and brush pickup may be delayed due to equipment failure and weather. However, we will make every effort to pick them up in a timely manner.

Pool Guidelines With the summer heat our thoughts turn to cooling off in a pool. The City of Social Circle has adopted the State code regarding swimming pools which requires that owners obtain permits for pools. Any aquatic vessel that has a water depth of under 12 inches and is drained and filled daily is not required to have a permit. All other aquatic vessels will require a permit. In addition, all pools are required to have a barrier, a permanent fence, wall, building wall, or combination that surrounds the aquatic vessel and obstructs the access to the vessel. The purpose of the barrier is to provide significant restricted access and reliable latching devices on entry points to an aquatic vessel so that children cannot gain access unless an adult provides such access.
