Police Chief's Corner

The Social Circle Police Department wants you to be on your guard when using Automatic Teller Machines. Try to use ATMs during daylight hours. If you must go at night, do not go alone.



Avoid ATMs that are not well lit or clearly visible from the street. Be aware of people loitering or sitting in cars around ATMs. Prepare your transaction ahead of time. And please, do not give out your Personal Identification Number to anyone. Many thieves will attempt to steal your PIN number by telephoning you and claiming they are the police, security officers, or bank officers. Memorize your PIN and do not keep a copy of it in your wallet. And lastly, either keep your ATM receipt or tear it up and throw it away. We want you to be safe and your finances protected.

City of Social Circle Q&A:

Q: What should I do with my bulk trash now that Waste Management no longer picks up old furniture? A: If you do have bulk items that must be disposed of, you can take them to the Monroe Transfer Station at 213 Cherry Hill Road or the Keep Walton Beautiful facility at 2051 Leroy Anderson Road in Monroe. There is a charge to dispose of bulk waste at these facilities. A Dumpster Day for City residents to dispose of bulk trash will be held this fall, on Sept. 24, and again in the spring.

Q: With the new sanitation truck, what is the proper way to place my trash can on the curb for pick-up? A: The proper way is to face the handle of the cart toward your home, and the outside bar (midway) on the can should face the street.
