- Have deadbolts

   installed and keep
   doors and windows locked.
- Install motion sensors lights outside.
- Install a peephole in your front door.
- Do not leave keys outside in obvious places.
- If possible, install a home security system.
- Retrieve your mail ASAP from your mailbox or set up a P.O. box.
- Never allow an unsolicited contractor to enter your home
- Ask for identification even if they say it is an emergency.
- Call the company to confirm the individual is meant to be there.
- Call 911 if you sense something is not right.
- Carry a cell phone with you.

# **City of Social Circle Q&A:**



Q: How can I confirm if my online payment has been processed?

A: When you make a payment using the online bill pay system, you will receive a transaction number and

an authorization code from your credit card company. These numbers are both included in the online receipt. Please print these numbers and keep them as proof of payment until your transaction has been posted by the City and the charge appears on your monthly credit card statement.

Q: Will I be able to pay my utility bill late?
A: Yes, the system will accept any payment. Acceptance, however, does not relieve you of any interest, penalties, late fees, possible cut-off, lien, fi-fa, or any other legal ramifications associated with late payments. Please be aware that weekends, City holidays, bank holidays, and other non-work days may interfere with processing and posting of payments.

### Avoid heating mishaps, practice fire safety this winter



The Social Circle Fire Department offers these heating safety tips for the winter:

Space Heaters

- Space Heaters
- Keep anything that can burn, such as bedding, clothing, and curtains, at least 3 feet away from the heater.
- Make sure the heater has an automatic shut-off, so if it tips over, it shuts off.
- Turn heaters off when you leave the room.
- Plug portable heaters directly into outlets and

never into an extension cord or power strip.

#### **Fireplace**

- Keep a glass or metal screen in front of the fireplace to prevent embers or sparks from jumping out.
- Do not burn paper in your fireplace.
- Have your chimney inspected and cleaned each year by a professional.
- Put the fire out before you go to sleep or leave your home.
- Put ashes in a metal container with a lid, outside, at least 10 feet from your home.

#### **Wood Stove**

- Make sure your wood stove is 3 feet from anything that can burn.
- Do not burn paper in your wood stove.
- Put the fire out before you go to sleep or leave your home.

#### **Furnace**

- Have your furnace inspected each year.
- Keep anything that can burn away from the furnace.
