City of Social Circle Q&A:



Q: What is the proper way to place my trash bin?

A: Place your bin at least 3 feet from other objects, like cars and mailboxes. Place the wheels of the bin toward the house and

have the front metal bar facing the street. All trash inside the bin must fit inside with the lid closed. No refuse outside the bin will be collected. This will allow the garbage truck's automatic arm to lift and empty the bin without damaging it.

Q: How much does an extra trash bin cost?

A: Extra bins cost an extra \$18.74 a month.

Q: Who do I contact if I need a broken trash or recycle bin replaced?

A: Email the billing clerk at jturner@socialcirclega.gov. Provide your name, phone number, and address. Let us know if you need a broken bin swapped out, need an extra one delivered, or want one removed.

City debuts new leaf vacuum truck



The City has a new leaf vacuum truck to pick up yard debris. The new truck allows the City's street department crew to be more efficient. Please help our crew by NOT putting large limbs or metal pieces in with yard debris as it can damage equipment. Leaves, grass clippings, and pine straw are acceptable. Customers do not need to bag leaves. Here are some tips to make the process easier:

- Rake leaves to the curb or road
- Make piles no higher than

- 3 feet and 6 feet in diameter
- Place piles horizontally along the curb for timelier and easier pickup by city crews.
- Limbs should be cut to no more than 7 feet in length
- Bagged leaves will be picked up and transported to the City's leaf drop off area. A load is about 8 feet by 8 feet by 4 feet.
