City News

EPD Burn Ban Change & The Environmental Protection Divisions Summer Burn Ban ends September 30th and Senate Bill 119 has changed Georgia's Outdoor Burn Rules in O.C.G.A. 12-6-90. The law no longer requires a burner to inform the Ga. Forestry Commission online or by phone about their intention to burn leaf piles and yard debris. New Legal Safety requirements are now specified for this type of burning. Effective July 1, 2021 Any person, firm, corporation or association intending to burn hand piled natural vegetation/yard debris in Georgia is required to adhere to FIVE Safety precautions that are mandated by law: Space- 25 feet between the firm and woodlands, Space- 50 feet between fire and structures, Time- Sunrise to Sunset, Attendance- Person responsible stays onsite until fire is completely extinguished and there is no risk of burn escaping, and Réasonable Precautions- Some examples are: tools/measures in place to prevent escaped fire. These include continuous pressurized water source on site; man-made or natural barrier to contain fire, such as bare soil, rocks, bricks, burn barrel, etc.; hand tools or fire containing equipment on site, such as rake or shovel, garden hose, etc.; weather awareness-to NWS red flag warnings, High Fire Danger designation of Very High or Extreme days and other hazardous conditions, low relative humidity, high winds, etc. Other: Agricultural and land clearing burns for residential and commercial development DO require notification to the county forest ranger and a permit IS still required for these type activities. Note: Person responsible is liable for damages to adjacent properties due to fire escape. Unlawful Burn Notices may be issued, and suppression charges may apply if the stated safety requirements weren't followed and wildfire results.

Trees and Shrubs As we enjoy a beautiful summer with ample rain, you may have seen an abundance of new growth from your trees and shrubs. If your plants are growing into the streets or sidewalks, please trim them so that pedestrians and vehicles can safely pass, and that visibility is not obstructed. Thank you for your help in keeping Social Circle beautiful

Utility News

How to Check for Leaks A small leak, about the size of a pin head, dripping at one drop per second can add up to 7 gallons of water a day. A large leak, the kind most often found in toilets, can waste 200 gallons of water or more per day! Check out the following when you suspect a leak:

Check faucets in the bathroom and kitchen periodically. Worn washers are most often the cause of dripping faucets.

<u>Sprinkler Systems:</u>

Broken sprinkler heads or damaged underground pipes are common sources of sprinkler system leaks. Watch your system run at least once per month to spot problems early. Usually, léaks are easy to fix. Do-it-yourself books with easy-to-follow instructions are available at libraries and home improvement stores.

Check toilets for leaks often. The most common causes of a leaking toilet are:

1. Float device set too high, which causes water to run into the overflow tube

2.A warped or cracked flapper

Inexpensive toilet leak kits are available at home improvement stores.

Use your water meter to determine if you have a leak:

- •Make sure no water is being used inside or outside (no washing machine filling, no shower running, no watering outdoors, etc.).
 •Locate your water meter box. Carefully remove the cover and lift the top of the meter.
- •Find the red Leak Indicator on the meter dial. If all your water sources are off and the Leak Indicator is rotating, you may have a leak. Leaks can waste thousands of gallons of water in a just a few days. It pays to fix leaks promptly.

Gas and Water Meters Please keep any bushes and grass trimmed around the gas and water meters on your property and keep pine-straw away from water meters. This makes it easier to get an accurate reading while avoiding the possibility of snake encounters. The warm winter means more snakes, which are out and about and may be hiding in bushes, pine straw, or tall grass. Also, as a reminder, please do not park vehicles, trailers, or anything over the meters.

Summer Mowing 🗞 With the plentiful rain we have had this spring, the grass is growing rapidly. Your city crews are working continually to mow city properties. Please help keep our city looking good by mowing to the curb or street edge in front of your property whên you mow your lawn. By working together, we can all save tax dollars and contribute to the charm of Social Circle. Thank you for your assistance!

Help Keep Our Sewers Healthy * Flushable wipes are not all biodegradable. Even when a wipe claims to be flushable, the wipe does not break down in the same fashion as toilet paper. The wipes are made from high strength fibers that do not lose their strength and do not breakdown with time, which can lead to clogs not only in your household lines, but also in city sewer lines. Our sewer filtering system has had issues clogging up with disposable wipes as well as creating clogs in the sewer pipes by combining with grease and food wastes. Please do not flush or dispose of any wipes into the Social Circle sewer system. <u>Just because</u> something is labeled flushable, does not mean it should be flushed! Leaving flushable wipes and similar items out of the system will help us continue to provide outstanding sewer service and allow the outflow to run smoother. No one enjoys the smell or sight of a sewer backup.
