Surveyors Gathering Data for Sidewalk Construction \Rightarrow Starting February 10, crews will be working along East Hightower Trail from Jones Rd to Vine Circle and along South Cherokee Rd from Spring Dr to Cannon Dr and North Cherokee from Oak Rd to Rose Ln to gather information about the locations of proposed new sidewalks and drainage improvements in the area. They will be taking pictures, using survey equipment and performing tests, such as gathering soils samples to ensure minimal disruption to natural, cultural, and built environment based on the location of sensitive ecological, archaeological, and historic resources. The sidewalk construction will be paid for by a Federal Grant and will expand the existing sidewalks. Residents who will be affected by this work should receive a notice in the mail. If you did not receive a notice and believe your property will be affected, please contact Robbie Groves, 770-464-6908, rgroves@socialcirclega.com.

City Council Strategic Goals > Each year in January, the City Council meets to plan out their year. In January after an election, the City Council sets their strategic goals for the next two years. There are typically five or six goals that the Council selects as their guiding principals. This year the City Council selected seven items.

- 1. Provide a new 1.5 MGD Wastewater Treatment Plant to serve the City, which can be expanded with future demands.
- 2. Repair and Rehabilitate Existing Sidewalks and Continue Sidewalk Extensions.
- 3. Update the City Charter and Code to Simplify and Streamline, Strategically.
- 4. Adopt an Economic Development Strategy for Social Circle to guide the Development Authority of Social Circle and the Walton Economic Development Authority.
- 5. Explore strategies to expand Youth engagement and opportunities within the Community.
- 6. Increase transparency of City Government and expand communication between the City and the community.
- 7. Develop an approach for storm water which balances community willingness to fund new revenues with desired City service levels.

Keep Our Sewers Running Freely & Dumping oil and grease down the drain can cause blockages to your household lines, clogs to sewer lines, wastewater treatment plant problems and environmental concerns. And, despite the name, "flushable" wipes are not really flushable. The wipes are made from high strength fibers that do not lose their strength and do not breakdown with time, which can lead to clogs not only in your household lines, but also in City sewer lines. Blockages from grease and wipes can lead to sewer overflows and fines from the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (EPD). Please help us to reduce blockages in the City sewer lines by throwing used grease and wipes into the trash.
