Home Repair Grants for Low-Income Residents & The City is applying for the Community Home Investment Program (CHIP) grant funding to rehabilitate owner-occupied homes in our community. CHIP is a federally-funded grant program that seeks to provide safe, decent, and affordable housing in Georgia by granting funds to city and county governments, public housing authorities, and non-profits to rehabilitate owner-occupied homes and build and renovate affordable single-family homes for sale to eligible home buyers. If the City receives this grant, there will be up to \$50,000 available per home to rehab up to six homes. To qualify, you must be the homeowner and occupy the house, and make less than 80% of the area median income. City Bus Schedule Updated Starting Monday, January 13, the bus will go to Monroe at 8:30 am on Tuesdays and Thursdays and will go to Covington at 9:00 am on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. There will no longer be service on Saturdays, except for special events. There will be no scheduled pickups between 12:45 pm and 1:15 pm to allow for a lunch break. All trips must be scheduled 24 hours in advance by calling 770-464-2953. There will be no exceptions to this policy. These changes are to improve service within the City and to accommodate more passengers.

Utility Payments Through Bill Pay If you use bill pay through your bank, please update the account number on your payment to the account number showing on your bill. The account numbers changed when the City financial software system was upgraded last year. This will help ensure that your payment gets credited to the correct account.

USDA Section 504 Home Repair Program & The USDA Rural Development (USDA-RD) 504 Home Repair provides loans to very-low-income homeowners to repair, improve or modernize their homes or grants to elderly, very-low-income homeowners to remove health and safety hazards. This program has grant funds available up to \$7,500 or loans up to \$20,000. To qualify, you must be the homeowner and occupy the house, be unable to obtain affordable credit elsewhere, and have a family income below 50 percent of the area median income. For grants, you must be age 62 or older and not be able to repay a repair loan. For additional information, please contact the Monroe area USDA-RD office at 770-267-1413.

Need Help with Your Energy Bill? The Georgia Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP), is a Federally-funded program that helps low-income households with their home energy bills. This assistance can reduce the risk of health and safety problems such as illness, fire, or disconnection. The Georgia LIHEAP program may be able to offer you one or more of the following types of assistance: energy bill payment assistance, energy crisis assistance, weatherization and energy-related minor home repairs. To be eligible, you must be a U.S. citizen or legally admitted immigrant, the total gross annual household income is below 60% of the state's median income, and have full responsibility for paying cost of energy bill for the primary home heating source. Residents 65 + or homebound can apply November 1 through April 30. All other eligible residents may apply for assistance beginning December 2 through April 30.
